HOW TO ENTER

Fill out & sign the relevant entry form for each class entered. Forms are located in the schedule or can be downloaded from www.temorashow.com.au or the Temora Show Facebook page. Entries will be taken at Temora Community Centre two weeks prior to the show between 10AM & 4PM and in the showground pavilion from 9AM on Thursday & Friday prior to showday. Retain your entry tickets for safe and timely collection of exhibits. Check closing times for each pavilion class carefully

STANDARD CLASS RULES

Written entries close 11am Wednesday prior to the show. Limit of 2 entries per person, for each section of each class. Please read each section carefully. No exhibits to be removed prior to 6PM. Late entries may be accepted at the pavilion co-ordinators discretion. Pavilion will close promptly at Saturday 6PM and re-open 6:30pm for collection of exhibits. Entry fees: 50c per entry up to 10 entries, capped at \$5 thereafter

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

All care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be held by the Temora Show Society, its members or volunteers. The committee shall not be responsible for any damage or loss to exhibits, any accident that may be caused through, or by, an exhibit and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the committee harmless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from any action, loss or damage for non-delivery of any exhibit. All decisions of the judges are final. Exhibitors must follow the requests of the stewards at all times. Only stewards, committee & judges are allowed in the pavilion during judging. The committee & stewards reserve the right to reject or remove any exhibit and will give a reason for doing so. Exhibit collection will be available from 6:30pm to 7:30pm on show day. You must present your entry ticket to the section steward who will assist you with the process and mark your exhibits as returned. The pavilion will also be open on Sunday after show day between 12pm – 2pm. Prize money can be collected on show day at the secretary's office from 1pm – 3pm on show day. Any money not collected by 31st October will be forfeited. Your generosity will assist in the running costs of the show.
